



Exercise Rules

1. Work as a team. Communicate, strategize, and operate as a team.
2. Team members are allowed to talk with each other during all parts of the CSI competition. This is simulation=ng a real-life investigation.
3. **DO NOT** communicate or discuss your findings or analysis with any other team. Your team's analysis is yours alone. You will be graded on the accuracy and completeness of your analysis.
4. You will have 20 minutes to evaluate and collect evidence from the crime scene.
5. You will have 45 min to organize the evidence you have identified and summarize your findings into a written narrative.
6. Teams are encouraged to identify their roles and responsibilities early in the process to maximize efficiency.
7. You may take pictures of the crime to use or reference during the analytical phase of the exercise. After the exercise we will collect all pictures taken and have you upload them into a cloud account. Other teams will not have access to your work product.
8. During your analysis phase you will have resources available for you to visually organize your evidence as you construct and draft your narrative. I strongly encourage you to utilize the A-M-P model framework for organization and your analysis
9. Exercise Proctors will be walking around in each CSI room to grade and evaluate your progress.
10. Proctors will keep time
11. During the analysis phase, (in the report writing room) you will be able to submit two (2) questions for clarification or additional information. As in real life, answers may be partial, incomplete, or delayed. Please take this into account
12. At the end of the analysis phase, the top 5 scoring teams will be selected to advance to the briefing phase. Of those 5 teams, the winner will be selected.
